Cover Story



Sarah Woodward, who grew up in Beckley, wrote to us at the end of March to share the news that her small business in Horton-cum-Studley had won a weekly competition to join #SBS, Theo Paphitis's exclusive (and very supportive) community.

Invisible Birds and How to Find Them. by Lyn Ebbs

As a term to describe people who interact with birds, I find 'bird-watcher' too restrictive. At this time of year, I'm more of a 'bird-listener'. In early April I was able to take part in one of my favourite surveys on RSPB Otmoor in which hearing the bird is key.

The bird whose presence we were trying to record is the Water Rail. An



attractive relative of moorhens and coots, it's notable for its ability to hide in dense reeds, so bird-watching wasn't going to achieve our aim. As a rule, playing a recording of a bird's song or call to lure it out can be harmful as it may stress the bird, and isn't allowed on Otmoor. But we have a licence to use

recordings once a year to carry out this survey. The call is certainly not a tuneful song - it sounds more like an annoyed piglet, squealing and grunting at high volume. We call and the Water Rails call back.

The rails are more likely to perform in the early morning, so we aimed to be up with the larks but on this bright and breezy day, the Skylarks had already taken to the air. We splashed our way through puddles along a path

taking us into the conservation area. Although Skylarks' preferred meadowland habitat, and behaviour is the very opposite of Water Rails' they can be just as difficult to see. They are light brown in colour, with a paler streaky breast and a small crest on the crown. Though they will sing from a perch, typically they sing Skylark - Ben Andrew (rspb-images.com)



in flight, climbing higher and higher until they are almost impossible to spot. At the end of the song flight, the bird descends while still singing but falls silent for the final few metres until it reaches the ground. Though a fairly nondescript bird to look at, the incessant outpouring of song from dawn to dusk has made it beloved of poets and musicians.

By this time playing our recording was picking up responses from Water Rails hidden deep in the reed beds but it also seemed to trigger a totally different bird to reply. Another 'little brown job', the Cetti's Warbler is

described as a compact warbler with a tendency to cock its tail. As they



like to keep concealed in dense vegetation, usually near water, this is not that helpful in identifying them. Though seeing them is a real challenge, they helpfully announce their name in a loud explosive call: 'Listen! What's my name? Cetti, Cetti! That's it'. They are comparative newcomers to Otmoor, first

noted in 2002. Following two hard winters, they disappeared temporarily in 2012 but since then, their numbers have steadily increased.

Our course had now taken us deep into the reserve, alongside the original course of the River Ray, north of the two reed beds that act as deep-water reservoirs and are favoured by another hidden bird. Superb camouflage, stealthy movements and the ability to remain motionless make the Bittern a challenging bird to see. This stocky brown heron was also first recorded on Otmoor in 2002 but it wasn't until 2013 that a male was first heard

making its characteristic low-frequency call. It's a far-carrying, foghorn-like noise, known as booming, which the polygamous males use to attract females. They call from the parts of the reserve with the densest stretches of reed bed to entice in the females to nest. The first nest was in 2016 and there have been at Bittern - Ben Andrew (rspb-image



least three nests per year since 2021. The same male probably services all three nests but then leaves the females to rear the chicks.

There are not just these four birds to hear on Otmoor and with a few places left on the Dawn Chorus Walks on 4 or 11 May at 5.30am, you can immerse yourself in the full avian symphony. Contact Otmoor.admin@ rspb.org.uk to book.





Land North of Bayswater Brook [LnBB] Update Please sign our petition:

STOP Development of Land North of Bayswater Brook, north of Oxford - https://www.change.org/STOP-LNBB-NOW



The Environment Agency has objected to the LnBB planning application on two grounds –

- 1. That Thames Water does not have the capacity to process the sewage from LnBB (or any other large development)
- 2. The Local Plan STRAT 13 states that the LnBB development must only be built on Flood Zone 1 (land least likely to flood) and not on Flood Zones 2 and 3. The plans submitted do not comply with this.

English Nature and BBOWT have also objected. This is an opportunity to appeal to SODC to refuse planning permission.

It has been reported that Thames Water was due to upgrade its Oxford Sewage treatment works by 2025, but this has been delayed until 2030. Thames Water was apparently "finalising plans" for the £130 million upgrade works. However, since then their parent company have withdrawn investment and failed to pay interest on loans.

It is very likely that Christ Church and Dorchester Residential - the developers of LnBB, will appeal to the Secretary of State to try to gain planning permission despite EA's and others' objections, so we need to make our objections clear to SODC.

Other news

The planning application for the eastern part of the LnBB site, Bayswater Farm, owned by Cilldara Group (Headington) Ltd, has been rejected by SODC. This application is referred to on p16 of the March Four Parishes Magazine, where you will also find a map.

The main reason for refusal is that the proposed access from local roads is unachievable. There was also concern about development of the Green Belt and protection of wildlife. However, the developers may appeal.

Oxford Traffic Filters

Starting in November 2024, Oxford City Council will be trying a new way to reduce traffic congestion in and around Oxford.

Traffic filters are part of the central Oxfordshire travel plan and Oxfordshire's local transport and connectivity plan. They are designed to work together with other measures to:

- reduce traffic
- make bus journeys faster
- allow for new and improved bus routes
- make walking and cycling safer
- reduce local air pollution
- improve the health and wellbeing of our communities

What are traffic filters?

A traffic filter limits through-traffic along a small section of a road when travelling by certain modes of transport. Oxford traffic filters will be camera-enforced points on six roads in Oxford and will only apply to private cars.

There will be no physical barriers, and everywhere in Oxford will be accessible. If you drive a private car, you may need to take a different route or change how you travel if you don't have a permit to drive through the filter.

Locations

The traffic filters will be placed on the following roads:

- St Cross Road, central Oxford
- · Thames Street, central Oxford
- Hythe Bridge Street, central Oxford
- St Clement's Street, east Oxford
- Marston Ferry Road, Marston
- Hollow Way, Cowley

A detailed map of filter locations, together with more information about how the filters will work, their operating days, and who is eligible for a free permit, is available on the Oxford City Council website oxfordshire.gov.uk (type 'traffic filters' into the search).

Dame Elizabeth Holford's Charity News of Recent Bursaries

The Trustees have invited some of the young people who have received bursaries from the Charity to write a paragraph for inclusion in this magazine. This month's report is from Eliza Soanes who lives in Beckley.

"As part of my university degree in Animal Behaviour at Aberystwyth University, I volunteered at Lilongwe Wildlife Centre in Malawi for 7

months. I worked with a team of people to help rehabilitate injured, orphaned, and confiscated wildlife throughout Malawi. I helped with feeding primates, hyenas, servals, owls, parrots, bushbabies, duikers, and genets. I was also able to attend clinics that neutered cats and dogs for free to prevent overpopulation. I spent



some time volunteering at Liwonde National Park, using telemetry to track and monitor various species of wildlife for a Biodiversity Monitoring project. Throughout my journey, I met so many amazing people, volunteers, staff and locals with friendships and memories that will last a lifetime.

This experience was the most incredible opportunity I have ever had in my life. Without the help of The Dame Elizabeth Holford's Charity, it would not have been possible. This has inspired me to go back to Africa to help the animals and make a difference."


