The Organ

St Nicolas has a single manual pipe organ with mechanical action, built by Charles Martin of Oxford in 1883 and largely unchanged since then.

Concerts

St Nicolas has an excellent acoustic for small scale performances, with a subtle 'bloom' to the sound which gives great clarity and enables words to be easily heard.

On one Saturday or Sunday in June, July, August and September we serve Cream Teas in the church garden, followed by an early evening concert in the church. Core repertoire tends to be broadly classical with a focus on vocal or chamber music, but we are open to more or less any style of music as long as it is suitable for the space.

During Cream Teas, we also provide a gazebo in the garden and invite local musicians to give more informal performances, as pictured below:



Our 'Far from Home' concerts on Remembrance Sunday evening, at which we raise money for war-related charities, are another regular event.

Music is very important to us at St Nicolas Church, not only as part of our worship, but as a way of enhancing our beautiful building.

We aim to share our love of music with everyone, regardless of whether they would normally consider attending our regular church services.

This leaflet provides some information about our musical activities and aspirations.

St Nicolas Choir

The St Nicolas Choir in its present format was established by Peter and Julia Stutfield in 2017. Peter is the Organist at St Nicolas and Julia directs the choir.

The choir's main purpose is to sing Choral Evensong on the 2nd Sunday of each month and to lead special services at other times of the year. Singers sign up for individual services and there is absolutely no pressure to do every single one.

We also like to have a few singers to lead the music at our monthly Benefice Children's Service at 4pm on the 1st Sunday of the month.

The choir rehearses from 7.15 - 8.30pm on Wednesday evenings and for about 45 minutes immediately before each service. Specially recorded rehearsal tracks are usually provided on our website, and singers are expected to use these to practice at home if they need to do so.
